# 19 September Guest Speaker



The 214th Reconnaissance Group, located at Davis Monthan AFB in Tucson, flies the MQ-1 Predator over Iraq and Afghanistan via satellite from ground control stations in Tucson. The MQ-1 Predator is an unmanned aerial vehicle (UAV), which the United States Air Force describes as a MALE (medium-altitude, long-endurance) UAV system. It can serve in a reconnaissance role and fire two AGM-114 Hellfire missiles. The MQ-1 Predator is a system, not just an aircraft. The fully operational system consists of four air vehicles (with sensors), a ground control station (GCS), a Predator primary satellite link communication suite, and 55 people.

### **Legislative Update**

As we end our Chapter summer recess, so too do our national legislators as they return from their annual August break. Our thanks go to our Chapter President, Ron Perkins, who has kept you informed over the summer by e-mail on several legislative items that we thought would be of interest to you.

### **Federal Level Activity**

Currently, the House and Senate have approved separate versions of this year's National Defense Authorization Act. As usual, there are significant differences between the two. For example, the House bill but not the Senate bill would phase out the offset for all medical (Chapter 61) retirees, and similarly the Senate bill but not the House bill would eliminate the widows' SBP/DIC offset.

The bills now head to conference committee to hash out the differences between them. Our MOAA Government Relations team has been busy developing its annual package of inputs to the House and Senate Defense Authorization Bill conferees. The team is coordinating that major package with The Military Coalition, a consortium of some 35 national Veteran/Military Service Organizations which MOAA currently co-chairs. Working through The Military Coalition provides an even broader base of support and legislative constituency than MOAA can provide on its own.

End strength, concurrent receipt, early reserve retirement and TRICARE fees are among the top issues we are pushing that have approved bills in either a Senate or House version. Conversations with HASC and SASC staffs indicate that preconference negotiations will be underway shortly. Hill leaders hope to finish by the end of September, but that is probably optimistic. Historically, the final bill usually hasn't been finished until October or November. You may recall that last year most bill amendments were stripped from the final version at the last minute in order to quickly get the bill passed. With this in mind, we need to keep our eye out for any requests for grass roots support that may be forthcoming from MOAA as the process plays out.

### Meanwhile, Closer to Home

At the state level who would have thought that the end of August approaches without a balanced budget, although state law requires it to have been done in June. Given the budget impasse that has existed for months and the accompanying Senate moratorium on dealing with other bills, we had little hope of achieving any relevant state law changes impacting However, at the last minute the veterans. Senate lifted the moratorium to deal with a limited number of bills - 213 bills submitted and 190 signed. On the veteran side, we did see two significant achievements. Our Military Family Relief Fund bill, expanding assistance eligibility, and the bill allowing the finishing of the Enduring Freedom monument both passed and were signed into law by the Governor.

More importantly, the Arizona Department of Veterans' Services (ADVS) has taken only a modest budget hit so far that allows them to retain our complement of Veteran Benefit Counselors and the \$10 million of state matching funding for the State Veterans' Home in Tucson to be co-located with the VA Medical Center there. That matching funding has been combined with the federal 65% share from the stimulus package to allow the go ahead with the Tucson Home. Blueprints and project approval by the federal VA is complete and the ADVS is moving to the Request for Quote (RFQ) stage. The goal is to achieve groundbreaking for the new facility in January 2010.

### Good News for the VA Home

Although not strictly a legislative issue, I would like to report that the State VA Home here in Phoenix is also doing well. The Home recently passed both state and federal inspections with excellent marks. Thanks to the hard work of the staff and the initiative of some excellent new leaders, the Home is back in the good graces of the VA with occupancy approaching 170.
