- Improve Healthcare, including increase in Medicare Payments.
- Separate DIC payments from SBP.
- * Maintain/increase participation in the Unified Arizona Veteran's (UAV) affairs.
- Maintain participation in the Arizona Veteran's Hall of Fame (HOF).
- Fully develop the Chapter Web site and expand into a separate system with our own domain name. www.azchaptermoaa.com.
- Continue active involvement in the JROTC Awards and Monetary Scholarship programs
- Increase membership in the Chapter by gaining 25 Arizona National Guard and Reserve Officers to become members of the AZ Chapter.
- Increase Chapter involvement in Personal Affairs and provide help for the family after a member's death.

Membership

Currently the AZ Chapter has 200 members including, 50 auxiliary members and the seven new members for 2003. Worthy of note is that 100% of the Auxiliary Members renewed. This gives a renewal rate of 91% or if stated another way - it leaves 18 members that did not renew and will be dropped from the rolls. Legislation Survivor Benefit Plan (SBP) Equity Sought

Rep. Jeff Miller, R-FI., has introduced HR-548, which would phase out the current reduction in the Survivor Benefit Plan annuity for survivors that takes place at age 62. SBP annuities start at 55 percent of the amount of retired pay designated by the retiree and drop to 35 percent at age 62. This reduction, along with a relatively higher percentage of cost shares paid by military retirees, makes the military SBP inequitable in comparison with plans available to federal civilian retirees. The bill would phase-in increases over a fiveyear period, moving up to 40 percent on Oct. 1, 2004; to 45 percent in 2005; to 50 percent in 2006; and to 55 percent on Oct. 1, 2007. The bill has 131 cosponsors. Additionally, Senator Olympia Snowe R-ME introduced S. 451, the Survivor Benefit Plan Benefits Improvement Act of 2003 recently. Sen. John McCain R-AZ has joined Sen. Snowe as a cosponsor. This is a companion bill to Rep. Jeff Miller's H.R. 548. It would increase the age 62 SBP annuity over a period of five years. {emphasis by editor} [Source: Armed Forces News. & AFRETIRE]

E-mail Preference Service

If you want to reduce the number of unsolicited commercial emails you receive check out Direct Marketing Associations (DMA) E-mail Preference Service (e-MPS) at www.dmaconsumers.org. Here you can complete an e-MPS registration form online to be deleted from national commercial e-mail lists. Upon receipt, the DMA will distribute your request to companies subscribing to e MPS. Companies subscribe to reduce their advertising cost in transmitting to potential customers who are not going to respond. All DMA members who wish to send unsolicited commercial e-mail must purge their e-

mail lists of the individuals who have registered their e-mail address with e-MPS. The service is also available to non-members so that all marketers may take advantage of this service to eliminate the names of those who do not want unsolicited commercial e-mail. E mail of a business-to-business nature received at your place of employment is not affected through registration with e-MPS. The DMA does not provide marketers with consumer e-mail lists. Long-Term Care Open Season

Military members, federal employees, and their spouses, have a six-month window starting 1 July to take advantage of a streamlined application process for the Federal Long-Term Care Insurance Program. Federal personnel officials estimate that 20 million people may be eligible to enroll. The John Hancock and MetLife insurance companies offer the insurance through a contract with the Office of Personnel Management. Longterm care insurance helps people with chronic health conditions to pay for care givers and services that help them do such things as get out of bed, wash, dress, eat, go to the toilet, and other activities that the ill and frail find difficult. Long-term care may be provided at home, in a nursing home or in an assisted-living facility. Long term care is not medical care and usually isn't covered by medical insurance plans. Likewise, the long-term insurance program does not cover medical care expenses or medicines.

During the program's first "open season," from July 1 through Dec. 31, eligible military members, federal civilians, and their spouses need to answer a few health questions as part of the streamlined underwriting process. Underwriting is key: It determines an applicant's level of risk, eligibility to participate, premiums and benefits. On the other hand, because premiums for long-term care insurance are based upon age and state of health, all federal civilian and military retirees must undergo full underwriting, which involves answering more healthrelated questions and providing more information. The Long-Term Care Partners [http://www.opm.gov/insure/ltc] Web site www.ltcfeds.com has open season information kits and application instructions. There may be additional FLTCI Open Season enrollment windows, but none are scheduled or promised at this time. Procedures and rules could change for future open seasons. Or, if you provide your mailing address, the MVD will mail you a special plate application (eligibility requirements will be found on the reverse side of the application).]
