# MG Schneider Selected for Induction Into Military Aviation Walk of Honor

Chapter member Carl Schneider, MG USAF (Ret), will be inducted into the Commemorative Air Force (CAF) Arizona Military Aviation Walk of Honor on February 8.

The Walk of Honor, located at the CAF Arizona Aviation Museum at Falcon Field in Mesa, recognizes contributions made by Arizonans to the field of military aviation.

MG Schneider completed advanced pilot training at Williams AFB in 1948 and flew 100 combat missions in Korea. His assignments after that war included gunnery instructor and development of gunnery schools in the 1950s and helping establish the forward air control/air liaison officer program in Vietnam. He also served two tours at Luke AFB during his career. He retired as Chief of Staff, Air Force

Logistics Command, in 1978. He also is a member of the Arizona Veterans Hall of Fame.

Inductees are honored with copper plaques along the walkway leading to the museum's entrance.

# Naval Aviator, Weapons School Chief, Carrier Commander

Those are just a few assignments RADM James Symonds had during his 35-year Navy career.

As guest speaker at our January luncheon, he will recall highlights of that wide-ranging career, which included command of the aircraft carrier USS Ronald Reagan.

Admiral Symonds logged 4,000 flight hours in the A-6 Intruder and had more than 1.000 carrier landings during his career and also commanded the Medium Attack Weapons School at Whidbey Island, Washington.

He served as Deputy Director of Operations Operations in the U.S. for Counterdrug Southern Command and as Director of the Chief of Naval Operations Environmental Readiness Division.

His commands include the USS Nashville, an amphibious transport dock, and the USS Ronald Reagan, a nuclear-powered supercarrier with a

# **Bill Toy, Arizona Bushmaster**

Another in a series on past Chapter Presidents

LTC William Toy, USA (Ret), was Arizona Chapter president in 1963 following an Army career that took him to a variety of assignments in the Far East, with a White House-related stint in between.

He joined the Arizona National Guard in 1938 and was commissioned a second lieutenant in 1942. He was a proud member of the Arizona Bushmasters Regimental Combat Team that gained fame in World War II.



During that war he served in the China-Burma -India Theater and was on General Joseph (Vinegar Joe) Stillwell's staff as an infantry weapons instructor and liaison officer to the Chinese Army.

After the war, he served as a White House courier for a forerunner to the CIA. In 1950 he was sent to Korea and Japan, attached to General Douglas MacArthur's Allied Translation and Interpretation Unit. Following a tour in the States, he returned to the Far East as an infantry commander with the Military Advisory Group in Taiwan and later served in Okinawa.

LTC Toy worked in state and city government and veterans service organizations after retirement. In addition to serving as Arizona Chapter president, he held a variety of other officer positions.

Bill was elected to the Arizona Veterans Hall of Fame in 2002. He died in 2008. His wife, Angela, is still a member of our Auxiliary.

### Legislative Update by Gary Fredricks National Legislative Chair

# Some Progress, Some Can-Kicking

Congress is currently enjoying its annual yearend holiday and is not scheduled back to work until the week of January 6. As I am sure you are well aware, Congress managed some progress in some areas and managed to kick the can further down the road in other areas during their short session between the current Christmas break and the preceding Thanksgiving break.

#### The Good News

As required by the continuing resolution that currently funds the government through January 15, 2014, a bicameral budget committee actually managed to piece together a bipartisan budget for FY2014 before the December 13 deadline. The good news is that they actually did it and it was passed by both houses and approved by the president before the year-end break. It also provided for a three-month delay in the 24% cut in Medicare/TRICARE payments to doctors that was scheduled to phase in on January 1. The new deadline for action to further relieve the payment cut requirement is now April 1 with signs pointing to a way toward permanent relief.

#### The Bad News

The bad news is that the budget had some serious issues, such as the requirement to limit annual cost of living increases for military retirees who are less than 62-years-old by one percentage point below the annual inflation rate prescribed by law. Supported by almost 200,000 e-mails from MOAA members, MOAA and the Military Coalition fought a good battle to have the requirement removed. In the end, it didn't happen for us, but it remains at the top of our legislative priorities for 2014.

It's also important to note that the budget agreement, while setting funding limits for the fiscal year, is only a first step in the process. The 12 annual appropriations bills, including one for DOD, are still required to appropriate money to the government departments. As it

now stands, either the appropriations bills or an extension to the continuing resolution or some combination of the two is required before the current continuing resolution expires on January 15. That doesn't give much time for Congress to act after their return from the holidays. And, oh by the way, the government is still on track to reach its debt limit sometime in February. That could be the next big congressional battle, especially given the fact that the budget agreement didn't effectively resolve the long term budget conflict.

### Won Some, Lost Some

For DOD the other important legislation is the Defense Authorization Bill which provides further fidelity into how DOD can spend the money it is appropriated. Congress also managed to pass that legislation for FY2014 before going on break. However, as has been the case over the last couple of years, the time crunch caused Senate leadership to consider several amendments that MOAA was advocating for that were actually in the House version of the bill that was passed earlier. So, in the end we won some and we lost some. I think that from our perspective, the biggest win was in avoiding any increases in TRICARE or pharmacy costs to us.

Among the battles left to fight again next year are military pay raises, SBP-DIC offset and remaining concurrent receipt issues. And if next year is anything like this year and the last few, our big effort will surly involve protecting what we have rightly earned.

# **About Prescriptions**

Finally, MOAA reports that, unless you get your medications from the base, the mandatory date for requiring prescriptions for maintenance medications from the TRICARE Home Delivery (mail-order) pharmacy system is now set for February 14, 2014. MOAA reports that if you are affected, TRICARE will be contacting you shortly. Please recall that you can opt out of the program after a one-year trial period. The requirement came from a compromise in the FY2013 Defense Authorization Bill that avoided large across the board TRICARE pharmacy copays being proposed by DOD.
