Luke Is Home to Air Force's Newest High Tech Fighter Jet

The fleet of aircraft at Luke Air Force Base will grow by 134 next year as the planned total of new F-35 Lightning fighter jets reaches 144. Ten of the jets are in place now.



Those numbers were related by Major Raymond "Cheeto" Chester, commander of the 56th Communications Squadron at Luke, as our November guest speaker.

Luke will be the training base for Air Force F-35 pilots and ground crews beginning in

May 2015. The trained pilots will go to Hill AFB, Utah, which will have the first operational squadron of F-35s.

The Navy and Marines will use their versions of the advanced technology stealth aircraft. It was developed in joint collaboration with the three services, the manufacturer Lockheed Martin and partner nations Australia, Turkey, Italy, Canada, Norway, Denmark, the Netherlands and the United Kingdom. In addition to Air Force pilots, Luke will train pilots from all the partner nations except the UK.

F-35s are expensive, but Major Chester quoted General Mark Welsh III, USAF Chief of Staff, who said, "Out there where people fight and die for real, if a 4th generation aircraft meets a 5th generation aircraft, the 4th generation aircraft may be more (cost) effective...it's also dead."

Major Chester also spoke of the quality of the enlisted personnel at Luke, telling of a young airman who administered CPR to a choking baby, saving its life, and a senior airman who

Burl Ives Helps Paul Win Points

The singer Burl Ives and graduates of West Point wouldn't seem to have much in common, but Dr. Paul Schnur found a connection while on assignment in Germany.



Paul, a Captain in the Army Medical Corps, was stationed at a military depot near the Rhine River in the mid-60s, where he was in charge of a hospital dispensary serving the needs of the troops at the depot.

He was dispatched to set up a surgical hospital at a NATO

war games exercise in western Germany, where the participants included a group of West Point graduates.

One evening, to his surprise, Paul was invited to dine at the generals' mess. After a few rounds of "martinis and wine," the West Point grads began singing their company song, "Private Rodger Young." The song was a

tribute to a World War II posthumous Medal of Honor recipient.

As the troops sang, Paul joined in, which was a big surprise to the West Point group. How did he know the words to that obscure song, they wondered. They also were impressed at his knowledge.

Turns out he learned it as a kid, a result of his mother being a fan of Burl Ives' singing. She played his songs on the old 45 rpm records of the day, and the ballad of the war hero was on the flip side of a bigger Burl Ives hit, "Foggy Foggy Dew." Paul learned the words from the repetitious playing of the ballad by his mother. And he still remembers the words today.

MOAA Launches Caregiver Guide

Earlier this year MOAA launched a significant new effort to help caregivers of wounded and injured warriors and veterans. It's a caregiver guide called *Tips for Lifelong Caregiving* and is the result of a partnership with the Elizabeth Dole Foundation. The goal of this effort is to raise awareness and support for the estimated 5.5 million military caregivers across America. Additional collaboration with the American Bar Association (ABA) and the Public Counsel Law Center helps address unmet legal and financial education needs of military caregivers.

2 Websites to Assist

This collaborative effort will operate two websites to assist caregivers. First is Tips for Lifelong Caregiving at <u>www.MOAA.org/</u> <u>Caregiver</u>. Edited and hosted by MOAA, this website provides information and resources on a range of issues, including health care, credit and bankruptcy, powers of attorney, wills and trusts, family law, guardianship, and the VA Fiduciary Program.

The second website is called Lawyers for Heroes at <u>www.lawyersforheroes.org</u> and will provide access to pro bono legal resources for users requiring more personalized help than what is offered on the Tips for Lifelong Caregiving site. Also hosted by MOAA, the site will include links to the ABA's military-and veteran-focused pro bono programs, including the ABA Military Pro Bono Project, the ABA Veterans' Claims Assistance Network, and Public Counsel's Center for Veterans Advancement.

One-Stop Shopping

Through this first ever collaboration, MOAA, the ABA and the Center for Veterans Advancement will create one-stop legal shopping for military caregivers. Examples of those who can be helped by legal assistance include a parent of a wounded veteran seeking education benefits for his or her child, a spouse of a veteran who lost his or her job and the family of a service member experiencing homelessness who is seeking help with housing benefits.

Some of you may know military caregivers and I hope you will share this information with them. In addition, many of the issues experienced by military caregivers are common to all caregivers. Some of our chapter members are in caregiving situations now and MOAA's new effort provides an information resource for them, too.

Legislative Update

The Work That Lies Ahead

As *The Sentinel* goes to press the elections are over, the lame duck legislative session has begun and Congress is on their annual Thanksgiving break. Little movement on the FY2015 Defense Authorization of Appropriations Bills has been reported, and Congress needs to take action to either approve FY2015 Appropriations Bills or extend the continuing resolution that is scheduled to expire on December 11 in order to avoid shutting down the government.

Make Your Voice Be Heard

All that and more needs to happen just to complete actions for this year with Christmas and New Year's breaks still ahead. MOAA has been tracking these actions and has asked our support through MOAA's Weekly Legislative Updates in urging Congress to adopt several amendments to the Authorization Bill. I hope you have added your voice and will watch closely for additional MOAA requests for support as this year rolls to a conclusion.

Then in January, work on the FY 2016 budget is supposed to begin with the seating of the new Congress. There is sure to be a lot of activity around trying to get relief on the defense budget constraints from the onerous effects of sequestration, which without further actions returns in full force with FY2016. Please watch for that also.

See Where Arizona Stands

If you are interested in how Arizona stacks up against other states in state level benefits to the military/retired communities, there is an excellent article in the November issue of the Military Officer magazine. The "State Report Card" contained therein shows Arizona rated red with no/minimal benefits for retirement/SBP exemption and property taxes for veterans and disabled veterans. The Arizona Council of MOAA Chapters recently adopted a motion to support an initiative by our Green Valley MOAA Chapter to once again seek some increase in our current \$2,500 military retired pay exclusion from state income tax. We have had limited success with this in the past due to the inability

to find the necessary funding, but we still need to keep trying.

Another excellent reference on comparison of state level military/veteran community benefits is the DOD State Liaison Quality of Life Issues listing. This can be found at:

Through this listing DOD seeks to engage and educate state policy makers, not for profit associations, concerned business interests and other state leaders about the needs of military members and their families. Just last year our Green Valley Chapter worked with the regional DOD Liaison and their local state legislators and got an Arizona bill passed that facilitates service members receiving licensure and academic credits for military education, training and experience, one of the issues on the DOD list. 
