Extreme Medical Interventions in Austere Environments: Disaster Relief to the Battlefield

Steve Ferrara, MD CAPT, MC, USN (Ret)

Steve Ferrara is a Scottsdale native who recently retired from the Navy after a distinguished 25-year career culminating in his role as the Navy's Chief Medical Officer and Director of Clinical Operations. Upon retiring in 2016, Dr. Ferrara transitioned to caring for veterans and his community in his newly created role as Chief of Interventional Radiology at the Phoenix VA Medical Center. A combat doctor, Captain Ferrara transformed military medical practice by introducing life and limb-saving endovascular therapies to the battlefield of Afghanistan as well as the disaster relief environment of the apocalyptic 2004 Asian tsunami. He will speak to us on combat medicine and the work being

VA Pre-Need Burial Eligibility

The Department of Veterans Affairs (VA) has implemented a Pre-Need Eligibility determination program to assist anyone who would like to know if they are eligible for burial in a VA national cemetery.

VA is promoting pre-need eligibility determinations to encourage Veterans and their eligible family members to plan in advance to use VA burial benefits that veterans have earned through their military service. Planning in advance for a veteran's or loved-one's final resting place can eliminate unnecessary delays and reduce stress on a family at a difficult time. Veteran families will have increased confidence that their loved ones are eligible for burial in a VA national cemetery at their time of need.

What's Included?

VA burial benefits include burial in any open national cemetery (there are 135 national cemeteries in 40 states and Puerto Rico), a grave liner, perpetual care of the gravesite, a headstone, a burial flag and a presidential memorial certificate. The eligibility requirements can be found at <u>www.cem.va.gov</u>, and include being discharged under conditions other than a dishonorable discharge.

Interested individuals may submit <u>VA Form 40-10007</u>, *Application for Pre-Need Determination of Eligibility for Burial in a VA National Cemetery*, along with a copy of supporting documentation of military service, such as a DD214, by: toll-free fax at 1-855-840-8299; or mail to the National Cemetery Scheduling Office, P.O. Box 510543, St. Louis, MO 63151.

What Happens Next?

VA will review pre-need burial applications and provide written notice of a determination of eligibility. VA encourages you to keep the decision letter with supporting documentation with your important papers in a safe place and to discuss you burial wishes and final arrangements with your loved ones or other representatives.

Applicants may indicate a *preference* for a VA national cemetery on the application form, but a

pre-need determination of eligibility does not guarantee burial in a specific VA national cemetery or a specific gravesite. VA assigns gravesites in cemeteries with available space once death has occurred and the burial is scheduled.

If you pass away, your next-of-kin, funeral home or other representative responsible for making your final arrangements should contact the National Cemetery Scheduling Office at (800) 535-1117 to request burial. VA will locate your pre-need decision letter and validate their determination.

Because laws affecting VA burial eligibility and individual circumstances may change, upon receipt of a burial request, VA will verify preneed decisions in accordance with the laws in effect at that time.

National Legislative Update

Defense Bill Nearing Finish

The FY2018 National Defense Authorization Bill (NDAA) enters one of its final phases, as lawmakers announced the list of conferees who will iron out differences between the House and Senate versions.

Fifty-eight lawmakers will help determine the fate of a range of national security issues affecting MOAA members on topics like the active duty pay raise, health care fees and survivor's benefits. The list of conferees includes every member of the Senate Armed Services Committee and half of the members of the House Armed Services Committee.

The committees are currently in conference, working to reconcile the two different versions of the defense authorization bill that passed their respective chambers so a final version can be passed by both Houses of Congress and sent to the President for his signature.

They will have their work cut out for them, as the two chambers had different opinions on several issues of interest to MOAA. Some of the top issues;

House Bill (HR 2810)

Regardless of the outcome, Congress first will need to come up with a budget agreement. Both bills raise defense spending levels above current statutory limits, which will trigger sequestration, an arbitrary budget-cutting mechanism that has disastrous impacts to the defense budget.

The House just passed their budget by a narrow margin with the Senate passing theirs earlier. Depending on what the budgets contain

for defense, the defense bill should move quickly through conference.

That means there's little time to influence the outcome on these important issues. MOAA needs our help now to send our elected officials an MOAA-suggested message to support key provisions in the defense bill.

Congressional defense leaders intend to have the conference negotiations completed by the end of October, in order to have a final version of the FY18 NDAA brought up for a vote before the Thanksgiving break.

Veteran Online Shopping Benefit Is Here

Beginning this Veterans Day, November 11, all veterans with an honorable discharge will be eligible to shop at the service exchanges online. Each service exchange - <u>NEX</u>, <u>AAFES</u>, <u>MCX</u>, and <u>CGX</u> - will have a portal to access the benefit.

First, however, veterans who could be eligible must visit <u>VetVerify.org</u> to gain access. The process may require several steps for some, so it is recommended you begin the process as soon as possible.

Proof of honorable or general under honorable conditions discharge requires, at least, submission of your full name and Social Security number and some type of discharge form, such as a DD Form 214, DD Form 215, DD Form 256, DD Form 257, or NGB-22. VetVerify has an FAQ with answers to common questions regarding eligibility.

The Number That Matters Most to You: 2 Percent

An unexpected rise in oil prices in September helped bump up the Consumer Price Index (CPI) for the year. This means that the Cost of Living Allowance (COLA) increase for retired pay, survivor annuities and Social Security will be 2 percent, starting in January 2018.

You will see a \$20 increase for every \$1,000 of retired pay received. The final COLA is determined by comparing the average CPI of the final three months of the fiscal year to the same quarter of the prior year. The 2 percent increase is the largest in a number of years.
