

#### Federal Legislative Update by Lee Lange, Legislative Chair

#### Inside the Biden Budget: Details on Pay Raise, TRICARE Fees, and More

The Biden Administration released the full version of its FY 2022 budget proposal to Congress on May 28, and MOAA's government relations team has been hard at work analyzing the 1,000-page proposal to understand the details and what issues need to be addressed in the upcoming budget cycle.

#### What Comes Next?

After the release of the Administration's preliminary budget April 9, Congress began meeting with administration officials to question them about their requests. Hearings will continue with the full version of the proposal.

Following this analysis, the House and Senate <sup>th</sup> Budget Committees will develop separate budget <sup>S</sup> resolutions, which will set the spending constraints for the upcoming fiscal year's mandatory and discretionary funding. Mandatory funding is used for existing federal programs like Social Security and Medicare. Discretionary funding is divided amongst the House and Senate Appropriations Committees, with the budget resolution setting the spending levels for each appropriations bill. Each of the 12 Appropriations subcommittees oversee the funding of the government's federal agencies and programs.

Additionally, the budget resolutions establish the budget authority for the annual National Defense Authorization Act (NDAA). The NDAA is the main legislative engine for MOAA's advocacy to affect change on DoD programs and policies. Work on the NDAA begins in the House Armed Services Committee and the Senate Armed Services Committee. Both committees will continue to conduct hearings with DOD officials and will begin markups for this year's NDAA.

In cases where a budget has not

been passed by Congress and signed by the president, and there is no CR in place, the government begins the process of shutting down. Government shutdowns further disrupt regular order in Congress and delays congressional business until the previously preventable funding emergency is resolved.

#### What MOAA Is Tracking

The DoD budget proposal is set at \$715 billion, an \$11 billion (1.7%) increase over the FY 2021 topline. Key takeaways include a 2.7% pay raise that remains tied to the Employment Cost Index for the military, and unlike years past includes the president's authority to program the civilian raise also at 2.7%. Additionally, the budget proposal does not include any new cost increases to TRICARE beneficiaries.

The budget includes a reduction of overall military end strength, which is concerning when considering the growth of the Space Force and growing threats from China and Russia. The proposed active-duty end strength would drop to 1,346,400 under the budget, from 1,351,000 in the enacted FY 2021 budget. Here is the breakdown by service:

- Army: FY 21 enacted 486,000; FY 22 proposed 485,000
- Marine Corps: FY 21 enacted 181,200; FY 22 proposed 178,500.
- Navy: FY 21 enacted 348,400; FY 22 proposed 346,200
- Air Force: FY 21 enacted 329,100; FY 22 proposed 328,300.
- Space Force: FY 21 enacted 6,400; FY22 proposed 8,400.

## State Legislature Budget Negotiations – Big Wins for Veterans

Arizona's state legislature has been focused on FY2022 budget negotiations for much of the last two months in a marathon legislative session. At stake are the state's 11 budget bills totaling \$12.8B. The legislature has until June 30 to approve a budget that can be signed by Governor Ducey. The most controversial issue in budget discussion has been Governor Ducey's plan to adopt a flat income tax for Arizona of 2.5%. Arizona's current income tax is based on five brackets topping out at 8%. Despite heated discussions over the impact of the \$1B tax cut, the flat tax was approved along party line votes and a narrow Republican majority.

The FY 2022 budget includes some of the biggest wins ever for veterans in the state. Here are three of them.

• Veterans Benefit Counselors (VBC's). Appropriates \$774K to hire 12 additional VBC's to help advise veterans in the state and assist them in submitting earned benefits claims. This issue has been top priority of Unified Arizona Veterans (UAV) for the last three years.

• State Veterans Home Mohave County. The budget calls for \$25M for a future veteran's home in Mohave County. This sum represents the state's share of construction costs. The federal government must put up 65% of construction costs or the money will not be spent. The Arizona Department of Veterans Services (ADVS) will continue detailed planning and coordination with the federal government to make the facility a reality.

• Veterans' Income Tax Exemption on Military Retired Pay. This initiative calls for full exemption, retroactive to January 1, 2021. The current exemption is \$3500. It is priced at \$45M and directly impacts over 54K military retirees in the state. Governor Ducey has previously expressed strong support for this initiative, and it was approved as part of the Governor's flat tax plan. This is a major step forward in making Arizona a veteran friendly state. AZ Chapter MOAA was awarded another LOE (Levels of Excellence) this past year. We received MOAA Communications awards for our website, which Rob Welch had been excellently maintaining for years and which Carl Ulrich has assumed and continued the excellent work. Carl, who contracts with us, has done an exceptional job. Our deep gratitude goes to Janet Lange for another year of truly excellent editing for the *Sentinel*! It is a timeconsuming job and we are better for having Janet in that key position.

The BOD has been sending out letters to remind everyone to catch up on their dues. We have received good response but still have a few who are 2 to 3 years behind. I will be calling those members to inquire as to their status. Those who are not caught up by August 5 will, reluctantly, be dropped from our roles and will no longer receive emails or the **Sentinel**.

I personally hope that you have all had the opportunity to be vaccinated. The few people I know in my private practice who got ill with COVID were unvaccinated. More than anything we are hoping to see everyone in person, healthy and ready for a new beginning as we return to normal.

I look forward to seeing you all in the very near future. Stay well and stay involved.



We met May 15 for our member luncheon meeting at the Scottsdale American Legion with our Non-Profit Partners to hear about their mission, who they support and how they provide that support to their military members and veterans.

With the 2021 MOAA Foundation Grant, our AZ Chapter MOAA will again be working with Youth for Troops and our veteran based non-profit organizations on July 27 at Sagewood to volunteer assistance to Arizona service members and veterans locally and Arizona servicemembers globally.

Youth for Troops spoke to our chapter several months ago and we were able to meet the other three organizations to hear about their mission and programs.

**Veterans First Ltd** -- Their mission is the prevention of homelessness and helping Women Veterans stabilize their lives. They provide referrals, resources and information to all Veterans, their families and caregivers.




