Always be aware of your surroundings and watch for suspicious activity. Residential burglaries are on the rise. Always lock your home's doors and windows. Most burglaries happen in daytime. Watch for suspicious people and vehicles in your neighborhood, and get to know your neighbors. She also mentioned ways of preventing package thefts, by checking your delivery status, or shipping your purchase to
